This Sunday, on the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, we ponder an unsettling mystery: the cross of Christ.

The Gospel recalls the desert experience of Moses and the Israelites on their journey to the promised land. God was angered by the people's complaints and sent fiery serpents which killed many. But God relented, and Moses was instructed to make the bronze image of a serpent on a pole and told that those who are bitten by the fiery serpents need only to look at the image and they will be healed. In the same way, Jesus tells us, he will be raised up on a cross and will be the source of life eternal for those who believe.

Jesus changed the meaning of the cross. A sign of man's inhumanity, it has become the central symbol of the Christian Faith because of the meaning Jesus gave to it: the humanity of God, of love, sacrifice, justice, and obedience.

The cross is central to Christian faith. You will never find a Catholic Church without a cross, occasionally a plain cross, but most often a crucifix with the figure of the crucified Christ on it. The sign of the cross has become life to every Christian: when Jesus chose to die on the cross, he put an end to death and let eternal life enter - salvation, through the cross.

This feast also reminds us that, as followers of Christ, we have our own crosses to bear. We need to accept our crosses and endure them in faith. We know that, like Jesus, our cross will not be the source of our end but the beginning of new life. Our cross reminds us that life is not a bed of roses. Nevertheless, it will lead us to life eternal.

EVANGELII GAUDIUM SUNDAY is celebrated each year on the Third Sunday in September. We proclaim the unique message of the Gospel that brings joy to all people who receive it with an open heart.

This year, the Church has been celebrating a significant anniversary. It's 1,700 years since the Council of Nicaea. This great gathering of Bishops from around the Church began the work to formulate the creed we proclaim Sunday by Sunday. It is the content of this creed that is our mission, so that we may know and love God in this life, in order to be happy with him forever in the next. **The creed begins with a profound proclamation, "I believe..."**

This is the theme for Evangelii Gaudium Sunday 2025.

2025 SEASON OF CREATION



This year's theme is 'Peace with Creation' and the symbol is 'Garden of Peace', both inspired by Isaiah 32:14-18.

Isaiah describes a desolate creation without peace due to injustice and the broken relationship between God and humanity. Today, more than ever, some human activities are at war with creation - the global impact of unsustainable lifestyles, excessive consumption, lasting pollution. However, there is hope for a peaceful earth. God's peace emerges when we work for justice, reconciliation, solidarity and harmony with creation. Through prayer and action we must repair our human relationships with Earth, with other creatures and with God.

The 2025 symbol titled "Garden of Peace," depicts a white dove flying over a tree. The left side of the tree is barren, with roots digging into dry soil, surrounded by an arid, desolate landscape. In contrast, the right side of the tree is lush and green, standing amidst a flourishing landscape. The dove, carrying an olive branch in its beak, flies toward the right—symbolizing peace as a transition from a war-torn, overexploited land to one that is fertile, thriving, and hospitable.

2025 SEASON OF CREATION

We are taking a few moments each day in personal and/or liturgical prayer for 'Peace with Creation'.

The second element of our Care for Creation is action.

Dcn. Huw reminded us in his homily last week that we can each do something to care more for our common home.

In 'Laudate Deum' Pope Francis said that the most effective solutions will not come from individual efforts alone, but above all from major political decisions on the national and international level. **However**, he continued, cultural changes will not take place without personal changes.

"Efforts by households to reduce pollution and waste, and to consume with prudence, are creating a new culture. The mere fact that personal, family and community habits are changing is contributing to greater concern about the unfulfilled responsibilities of the political sectors and indignation at the lack of interest shown by the powerful. Let us realize, then, that even though this does not immediately produce a notable effect from the quantitative standpoint, we are helping to bring about large processes of transformation rising from deep within society" [LD 71]

DECIDE TODAY ON ONE MORE ACTION YOU CAN TAKE TO HELP BRING ABOUT THESE PROCESSES OF TRANSFORMATION.

An action like permanently removing another single-use plastic from your daily life, like buying more locally produced products, buying more fairtrade/rainforest alliance products, improving your recycling and reusing, petitioning local and national authorities. You have ideas - turn at least one into action!

The Holy Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ is a symbol of hope for all, and His teaching in the Gospels a guiding light for lifelong learning and spiritual growth for those who work in Catholic education and formation.

On Education Sunday, we give thanks to Almighty God for the vocation of all who work with the children and young people in the Catholic education sector. The Bible tells us: "God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good" (Gen 1:31). His is "the earth with all that is in it" (Deut 10:14). For this reason, he tells us that, "the land shall not be sold in perpetuity, for the land is mine; with me you are but aliens and tenants" (Lev 25:23). FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PREPARATION PROGRAMME 2026



We run a preparation programme for children in Year 3 or above and their parents each year on Saturday afternoons in term time from **January until June**. We look forward to teaching and supporting the children and parents to develop their understanding of the sacraments of the Eucharist and Reconciliation, and to celebrating with you.

If your child is in Year 3 or above, and you feel they are ready to participate in the programme, you should complete a registration form, which will be available in person from 1st November from Fr John at church. The completed form should be returned to Fr. John by 30th November. Unfortunately, due to limited space and for safety reasons, we have to restrict the number of children we may accept on the programme to twenty. We will only accept official completed forms returned by the deadline, not photocopies.

The St Felix programme is a partnership between the catechists and parents/guardians, and your support at home is vital to your child's learning and engagement.

The more we can give, the more they can do.




