Dear Friends,

Today's feast marks both an ending and a beginning. It is the final celebration of the Christmas period, and yet it is also the first Sunday of 'Ordinary Time'.

The feast of the Baptism of the Lord is an appropriate occasion to mark the change from Christmastide to Ordinary Time. Jesus' baptism by John, which we hear about in this weekend's Gospel, marks the beginning of Christ's active ministry, and reaches its climax in the testimony of the Father as to the identity of the Son: Jesus Christ is the true Son of God, the beloved Son, with whom the Father is well pleased.

Jesus was not born simply in order to exist, to be God incarnate. He was born to serve. As he himself says, the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve. The ministry of Christ, in which he gives his life for us, is what a human life looks like when that life is lived by one whose existence is perfect love.

Today's gospel is the beginning of a journey, which, through our own baptism, each of us is called to travel. It is a journey full of purpose: to serve God, pursue justice, care for the vulnerable, and build His kingdom.

NEW LED LIGHTING IN CHURCH

Over the next couple of months we will be having LED Lighting installed inside church. Our external lighting has already been updated to LED lights. *This will continue to help reduce our carbon footprint, as well as our electricity costs.* We are also looking into the possibility of Solar Panels being fitted to the church roof.

The church will be closed from Monday 19th – Wednesday 21st January for the first stage of new LED lights to be fitted. This will involve replacing the existing light bulbs and fluorescent strip lights. Further work on the main body of the church will take place in February.

'Living Simply'

From: *Blessed by Less - clearing your life of clutter by living lightly.*

Living lightly is not just about the stuff we accumulate; and it's not just for people in the second half of life. It's about an attitude of living with fewer burdens and encumbrances, whether you are twenty one or sixty five. When done with honest self-awareness, the journey toward living more lightly has moved me to realise that I am blessed by less. Less stuff and worries have opened space to live with more contentment and meaning. Living lightly reminds me that my existence is more than accumulating possessions and status. Ultimately, I am on a spiritual pilgrimage.

As I continue to strip away the unnecessary stuff in my closets and mind, I've been able to see more clearly how much is enough, and how much is more than enough. It's a delicate dance to balance my own genuine needs with those of others. The spiritual paradox is that the less tightly I cling to my stuff, my way, and my concerns, the happier and more blessed I feel. Once I have enough less is more.

If we believe that a Divine Presence brought all of creation into being and it was good, then it follows that this God loves us unconditionally and sees our goodness despite our human failings. God's love for us is not dependent on our possessions, appearance, or accomplishments.
