Dear Friends,

Can we change our way of living?

A painter once wanted a picture of innocence. He found and painted a little child kneeling beside his mother at prayer. The palms of his hands were reverently folded, soft eyes upturned with an expression of devotion and peace. The painter prized this portrait of young Gareth above all else and hung it prominently in his study, calling it "Innocence."

Years later when the artist was old, the portrait was still there. He had often thought of painting a counterpart — the picture of guilt. One day he purposely visited a neighbouring dungeon. On the damp floor of the cell lay a wretched man, his name too was Gareth, bound in irons. His body was horribly wasted, his eyes hollow, vice sprouted all over his face.

Consent was given for the man to pose for the painting, and he sat as the model for "Guilt". As the work went on, the painter noticed changes in the man. His face seemed filled with tension, and his bloodshot eyes were filled with horror as he gaped at the likeness of himself painted on the canvas. One day, the painter sensed the man's uneasiness so much that he stopped painting and asked, "What troubles you so much?" The man buried his face in his hands and was convulsed with sobs. After a long time, he raised his head and inquired, "Don't you remember me? Years ago I was your model for "Innocence."

The old painter had succeeded admirably in his task of painting a counterpart for his picture of "Innocence", and the portraits hung side by side — "Innocence" and "Guilt."

Innocence had become guilt over time, but we must remember

that Christ came to us in human form - The Word who was with God and was God - and he died for us for the forgiveness of our sins: through Christ we can be forgiven for any and all of our sins if only we repent of them, turn our lives around from guilt to innocence again.

It is our mission to spread this good news. Announce the Gospel of the Lord through what you do and what you say.
