
A REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL by FR. ADRIAN GRAFFY

Having listened to the accounts of the appearances of the risen Jesus in the Gospel of John we now consider some of the words of Jesus from earlier in the gospel, which richly illustrate his mission and identity. We read from the Gospel of John throughout the Easter period due to its profound insights into the person and work of Jesus. It is appropriate to reflect on these deep truths and rich images as we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and his gift of new life to us.

Today's passage is taken from the tenth chapter of the gospel, which is renowned for Jesus' words: 'I am the good shepherd'. In fact, the chapter includes various sayings of Jesus relating to the image of the shepherd and his sheep. The use of this image, or parable, takes us back into the books of the Old Testament, where God is on several occasions described as a shepherd who has care for the sheep. The most famous instance of this is of course Psalm 22 (23), which begins with the words 'The Lord is my shepherd. There is nothing I shall want.'

Despite the brevity of today's passage from John's gospel, several important themes of the gospel occur. 'Belonging to Christ' as sheep to a shepherd presupposes hearing and accepting the word. In John's gospel we know Jesus himself as 'the Word'.

Finally, Jesus speaks of his relationship with the Father. 'The Father and I are one' is a statement of enormous importance in helping us to understand the person of Jesus and the doctrine of the Holy Trinity.



GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY - World Day of Prayer for Vocations

This Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday; a day when we reflect on how the ministry of Christ as Priest, Prophet and Shepherd continues in the Church through the ordained priesthood. Priests do not fall from Heaven ready-made. The call to priesthood needs to be heard, vocations need to be nurtured, and funding is needed to provide for priestly formation. The cost of training a priest is more than £150,000. We all have our part to play in praying and encouraging vocations and in financially supporting the formation of our future parish priests. <u>Reflections to inform our thoughts and prayers on</u> <u>'Living Simply'</u>

From *Dilexit Nos*:

"In a world where everything is bought and sold, people's sense of worth appears increasingly to depend on what they can accumulate with the power of money. We are constantly being pushed to keep buying, consuming and distracting ourselves, held captive to a demeaning system that prevents us from looking beyond our immediate and petty needs. The love of Christ has no place in this perverse mechanism, yet only that love can set us free from a mad pursuit that no longer has room for a gratuitous love. Christ's love can give a heart to our world and revive love wherever we think that the ability to love has been definitively lost." §218

supporting the work and mission of LORETO RUMBEK SCHOOL in South Sudan



The Loreto Rumbek Primary School

opened in 2010 to educate children from the local community aged 6-13 years. The school operates 2 shifts. The morning school is for 740 children and the afternoon school for a further 470 pupils.

In 2024 South Sudan was the most difficult country in the world for girls to access education. Although coeducational the Loreto Rumbek primary school prepares girls for secondary education and reserves 50% of the school places for girls. The primary school provides a daily meal for students, free health care, health education, and psychosocial support including trauma care. Loreto Rumbek also offers clubs for students to attend including sports, drama, science.

The biggest difficulty is keeping the girls in school. In South Sudan as a whole, the greatest dropout rate occurs in primary 4 (age 9) when around 50% of girls leave education. In Loreto Rumbek School the dropout rate for girls has been less than 5% for over 10 years.

Our target over the next 6 months is to raise at least **£1000** to support the work of Loreto Rumbek School. This is the cost of funding a pupil in the primary school and a student in the secondary school for 1 year.

There is a donation point in the narthex. You can donate cash (small change) whenever you can by placing it in the Loreto Rumbek School box. You can also donate using the dona card machine if you prefer.

We will let you know how we are progressing towards our target.
