Dear Friends,

This weekend's gospel reading is a bit of a challenge, in two parts. The first part states the passionate desire of Jesus, first in the language of fire and then of baptism. There is a sense of something tremendous about to take place, both destructive and purifying, and also a sense of foreboding.

The second part of the Gospel reflects the experience of the early church. When a person became a believer in Christ, it could affect the harmony and cohesion of the whole family. It may well be that we are back to that situation today. The conscious choice of discipleship and our full engagement with it can indeed be disconcerting if not disruptive for our families and friends.

Even so, many comfortably secure Christians are deeply attached to the status-quo that favours them. They consider it the main task of Christianity to help maintain law and order, to maintain what they perceive as their Christian values. To them it seems strange and wrong for Jesus to invite, not economic and social transformation, but a deep and radical transformation of society.

As Christians we should seek a better world. Those who really listen to Jesus are moved by his passionate desire for completely changed world. True disciples have "revolution" in their heart, in the sense of wanting a more just society. We need to work and pray to transform people's and nations' consciences.

Because of the stresses and strains of our work and families, we are seldom aware of what is going on, seldom inside ourselves enough to savour the flavour of the everyday routines....

Our search for fulfilment, or for love, or for meaning, or for God usually takes us towards something or someone outside ourselves, beyond our present experiences. What we find difficult to believe is that we can easily find within us what we seek so desperately somewhere else.

The trick is how to live in the present, how to be aware of what is just below the surface of our lives, how to come home to ourselves. God and joy do not have to be searched out and found. They are already here. But we need to be in the here and now too.

We are supporting the work and mission of LORETO RUMBEK SCHOOL in South Sudan



Our support for Loreto Rumbek School contributes to another important difference the school is able to make to girls and young women in Rumbek by providing them with protection from abuse, forced childhood marriages and early pregnancies.

This is Debora's story:

'My journey with Loreto Rumbek started way back in 2012 when I was admitted to Senior 1. (about 14 years old) At some points, I went through a difficult time and thought I wouldn't make it. I am a survivor of forced marriage.'

Twice Debora's extended family forced her into marriages they had arranged when she was 14 and 16 years of age. Her father tried to support her and with the help of Sr. Orla and Loreto Rumbek they succeeded and Debora returned to school and completed her education.

She now works as a Safeguarding Officer at the Disable Agency for Rehabilitation and Development (DARD) and is a teaching assistant at Rumbek University of Science and Technology. She is married. Debora is grateful to well-wishes who paid her school fees and all who stood with her during those earlier traumatic times.
