The quiet practice of virtue was the hallmark of the saints, who never published their holiness, but just tried to remain close to God, in a spirit of "loving attentive expectancy," as St John of the Cross put it.

This spirit marked the life of saint Thérèse of Lisieux, who died at the age of 24, after living as an enclosed nun from her teenage years. Some of the other nuns thought that Thérèse had achieved nothing at all in her short life. Yet within a generation, this young nun who had never left her convent was proclaimed Patroness of the Foreign Missions. Even from her cloister she let her light shine out. Reflecting on the three virtues that last, faith, hope and love, Thérèse saw prayerful love as her special mission in life. "In the heart of the Church," she said, "I shall be love." From that loving spirit the grace of God was richly channelled out to the missionary world.

Tyranny and oppression still flourish in many places abroad and closer to home. Unfairness and structural abuse often stare us in the face: long-term poverty, unemployment and homelessness. Christ invites us into solidarity with people who are in dire need.

How seriously do we take Jesus' challenge to be 'Salt of the earth' and to shine some Light in our world? St Thérèse shows us that we can truly make a difference through even the littlest things that we can do for others. Ripples from even the smallest actions can and will radiate out form this around the world! We can all add flavour to the lives of others and shed light into their dark times. Saint (Mother) Teresa of Kolkota said "You change the world one person at a time."




