#### Dear Friends,

We have now moved to the fifth week of Easter and we hear the parable of the Vine. The image Jesus presents to us today portrays our utter dependence on God. As branches, we can only bear fruit when we remain firmly attached to the vine.

This, I am sure, has and continues, to help us to get through these strange and very challenging days. As the lockdown eases for us, our thoughts and prayers remain with millions across the world who continue to suffer and lose their lives due to Covid-19, and with all who are supporting and providing what help they can in more and more challenging and desperate situations.

As we try to remain connected to the vine, we learn again, to live the gift of love. Through our prayers, acts of kindness and love for others, we share God's love. The message of the second reading is simple and calls us to action. To live in God's love implies keeping His commandments of – love of God and of our neighbour. Looking at the story of Paul in, we are reminded that we can never predict how and where God will speak to us. It is not difficult to imagine the fear of the Jerusalem church when they heard that Saul was back from Damascus. Some of them had probably witnessed his involvement in the death of Stephen, and now they were being asked to believe that he had become one of them. Surely it was a trick! It took Barnabas to show them the way - just as God was to be found in a crucified Messiah, why couldn't he now be working through Saul the Pharisee?

Sometimes faith demands that we take risks because God would have us look for him in the most unexpected places. If we are attached to Jesus the true vine, then our faith will be nourished, and we will remain in him.

# We are looking to recruit a foundation governor for the St. Felix school Governing Body.

Being a governor gives you the opportunity to help shape and guide the progress of St Felix School in the years to come. We are especially looking for people with skills in finance, marketing, curriculum enhancement, IT or fundraising.

Below you will find further information about being a governor but *if you have questions or are interested in working with us, please contact Fr. John*.

# The role of the St Felix Governing Body.

The school is a member of Our Lady of Walsingham Catholic Multi Academy Trust and the school governing body undertakes those responsibilities delegated to school level by the Trust board.

# The composition of the Governing Body

There are 6 Foundation governors appointed by the Diocese of East Anglia, 2 parent governors and 2 staff governors including the Head of School: 10 governors in total.

# Time involved.

Meetings of the Governing Body are held twice a term from 5:30-7:00 p.m. (approx.). You will be supported through access to training sessions, on specific topics. You will be expected to visit school as part of the monitoring processes, so that you feel confident knowing how the school is running. You will need to spend some time reading the agenda, the minutes and other papers to prepare for a meeting. Governor appointments are for a period of four years.

# Do I get paid for being a governor?

All school governors are unpaid volunteers.

# Conditions on becoming a governor.

Foundation Governors must be Catholic, over 18 years of age; not be bankrupt, nor have served a long prison sentence nor have been disqualified from working with children. All governors are required to sign a declaration to this effect and a DBS check will be carried out. Foundation governors have to be approved by the parish priest and Diocese.
