FROM FR. RICHARD ROHR'S DAILY MEDITATIONS – 22ND JULY 2022 'Love Is The Only Solution'

Love won't be real or tested unless we somehow live close to the disadvantaged, who frankly teach us that we know very little about love.... As we endeavour to put love into action, we realize that on our own, we are unable to obey Jesus' command, "Love one another as I have loved you." To love as Jesus loves, we must be connected to the Source of Love.

Over decades of serving New York City's poorest individuals, Dorothy Day (1897-1980) never lost sight of the gospel's challenging invitation to love:

'Whenever I groan within myself and think how hard it is to keep writing about love in these times of tension and strife which may at any moment become for us all a time of terror, I think to myself "What else is the world interested in?" What else do we all want, each one of us, except to love and be loved, in our families, in our work, in all our relationships. God is Love. Love casts out fear. Even the most ardent revolutionist, seeking to change the world, to overturn the tables of the money changers, is trying to make a world where it is easier for people to love, to stand in that relationship to each other. We want with all our hearts to love, to be loved. . . . It is when we love the most intensely and most humanly that we can recognise how tepid is our love for others. The keenness and intensity of love brings with it suffering, of course, but joy too because it is a foretaste of heaven."

"When you love people, you see all the good in them, all the Christ in them. God sees Christ, His Son, in us and loves us. And so we should see Christ in others, and nothing else, and love them. There can never be enough of it. There can never be enough thinking about it. St. John of the Cross said that where there was no love, put love and you would take out love. The principle certainly works...."

Love and ever more love is the only solution to every problem that comes up. If we love each other enough, we will bear with each other's faults and burdens. If we love enough, we are going to light that fire in the hearts of others.... It is love that will make us want to do great things for each other. No sacrifice and no suffering will then seem too much.

We pray that Pope Leo XIV be strengthened in his ministry.

May he continue building bridges that connect us to one another.

May he be an example of faith, hope and love.

We pray that you give him joy in his work and a renewed fervour for your Gospel message.

May he never lose sight of Christ

the forgotten and the outcast.

Christ Jesus, bless Pope Leo XIV —
and bless us, your holy people,
as together we strive to be your Body
in our wounded world. Amen.

THE LIVES OF OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS ARE BEING DEVASTATED BY DEBT

54 countries - from Kenya to Sri Lanka - are facing debt distress. Many are forced to spend more on payments to big banks, wealthy nations and global institutions than they spend on health, education or life-saving climate measures. Debts are being paid at the expense of hiring doctors and teachers, building schools, hospitals and sewage systems, preparing for floods, or coping with droughts.

Often, countries have already re-paid their debts once, but due to unscrupulous lenders and extortionate interest rates, they are often left paying for the original debt many times over.

We need to cancel unfair debts, build better financial systems and implement fairer laws to prevent future debt crises. And the time to act is now! 2025 is a Jubilee year, which is when the Bible calls for debt cancellation to restore justice and human dignity. This Jubilee year, people across the world are uniting in solidarity to demand action on to the debt crisis. Pope Francis said, "More than a question of generosity, this is a matter of justice."

ST FELIX PARISH PROJECT 2025

We are supporting the work and mission of LORETO RUMBEK SCHOOL in South Sudan



The Loreto Rumbek
Primary School
opened in 2010 to
educate children from
the local community
aged 6-13 years.
The school operates 2
shifts. The morning
school is for 740 children
and the afternoon school
for a further 470 pupils.

In 2024 South Sudan was the most difficult country in the world for girls to access education. Although coeducational the Loreto Rumbek primary school prepares girls for secondary education and reserves 50% of the school places for girls. The primary school provides a daily meal for students, free health care, health education, and psychosocial support including trauma care. Loreto Rumbek also offers clubs for students to attend including sports, drama, girl child education, science & maths.

The biggest difficulty is keeping the girls in school. In South Sudan as a whole, the greatest dropout rate occurs in primary 4 (age 9) when around 50% of girls leave education. In Loreto Rumbek School the dropout rate for girls has been less than 5% for over 10 years.

Our target over the next 6 months is to raise at least £1000 to support the work of Loreto Rumbek School. This is the cost of funding a pupil in the primary school and a student in the secondary school for 1 year.
