Happy Lent.

Having begun our journey through this Season of Lent we are given the opportunity to take a moment for reflection. Whatever we have decided to do for ourselves during Lent, giving somethings up or doing something extra, we can be reassured on our journey in Lent that when we have done what we can, God will do what we can't.

In the wilderness, there is no obvious nourishment, no water and no food. In some areas of the world, the wilderness or desert is a place of bare survival and water is the key to life. There are no support networks, no friends and no entertainment. The wilderness is a place of contemplation where we take time to choose our next actions. We think, look at our options and make decisions and commitments

In the wilderness, Jesus faced the temptation of turning away from God and seeking glory for himself. For us too, the wilderness is a place of searching where we must face up to ourselves, and to our own personal temptations. Am I greedy? Selfish? Over-ambitious? Am I compassionate enough to share what I have with those who have little or nothing? Sometimes it feels as though we are bombarded by temptation - it is hard to hear the voice of God above the hubbub of everyday life.

How can I make time and space to listen to God? What are my temptations, and what practical steps could I take to turn away from them towards God? All these questions call us to continue following Jesus during these days to renew us in our faith and prepare us to commemorate His Passion, Death and Resurrection as we come to Holy Week and Easter, and the joy of the Risen Jesus.

Ukraine Appeal Update: 1 year after the invasion [24th February 2023]

CAFOD thanks you all for your support to the Ukranian Humanitarian Appeal. Your donations are making a real difference to the people living through the conflict.

One way your donations are helping:

With Food:

In Ukraine - Provision of food assistance including hot food and food parcels at soup kitchens, and home deliveries for vulnerable individuals in hard to access areas.



In Kharkiv, Yana is a bicycle volunteer. When fuel is running low, crucial aid delivery can't be made by trucks and cars. CAFOD is supporting Depaul Ukraine to organise a team of bicycle volunteers – brave, defiant people like Yana – to deliver supplies to people who cannot leave their homes, including older people and people living with disabilities.

Thanks to your donations, and the incredible bravery of bicycle volunteers like Yana, vital food baskets reach 700 vulnerable people in Kharkiv on a regular basis.

Depaul Ukraine is an organisation CAFOD partners with and which has teams in Kyiv and Odessa as well as Kharkiv. Each day they deliver vital food and all together they are able to reach over 22,000 people with regular supplies.

In Romania, Poland and Moldova – your donations help with the provision of food assistance at refugee accommodation centres including hot food, food parcels, and vouchers.


