MASS for WORLD PEACE

On Thursday 1st January 2026, Feast of Mary, the Holy Mother of God,
we celebrate Mass and pray for Peace throughout the world.

An excellent way to start the new year of 2026!

Pope Leo's message for the World Day of Peace is for world leaders and individuals. It begins with the ancient greeting, "Peace be with you".

This is the Word of the risen Jesus (*Jn* 20:19, 21) that does not merely desire peace, but truly brings about a lasting transformation in those who receive it, and consequently in all of reality. The peace of the risen Christ is unarmed and disarming, humble and persevering. It comes from God who loves us all unconditionally.

Dear brothers and sisters, whether we have the gift of faith or feel we lack it, let us open ourselves to peace! Let us welcome it and recognize it, rather than believing it to be impossible and beyond our reach. Peace is more than just a goal; it is a presence and a journey. Peace is a principle that guides and defines our choices. Even in places where only rubble remains, and despair seems inevitable, we still find people who have not forgotten peace.

The peace of the risen Jesus is unarmed, because his was an unarmed struggle in the midst of concrete historical, political and social circumstances. Christians must together bear prophetic witness to this novelty, mindful of the tragedies in which they have too often been complicit. The great parable of the Last Judgment invites all Christians to act with mercy in this awareness (cf. *Mt* 25:31-46).

John XXIII was the first pope to advocate "integral disarmament," which can only be achieved through renewal of the heart and mind. He wrote: "Everyone must realize that, unless this process of disarmament be thoroughgoing and complete, and reach people's very souls, it is impossible to stop the arms race, or to reduce armaments, or - ultimately to abolish them entirely. Everyone must sincerely co-operate in the effort to banish fear and the anxious expectation of war from our minds. But this requires that the fundamental principles upon which peace is based in today's world be replaced by an altogether different one, namely, the realization that true and lasting peace among nations cannot consist in the possession of an equal supply of armaments but only in mutual trust.

Excerpts from Pope Leo's Message for the World Day of Peace, 2026

PRAYER INTENTIONS

God our Father, we pray for the many people who have asked for our prayers; for their healing and their peace. Hold them, shelter them and keep them in your tender care. Comfort those who grieve and give courage to those who are fearful. We ask this in the name of Jesus the Lord. Amen.

- Please pray for people requesting prayers in our 'Intentions Book'. Particularly remember those who are ill and those caring for them.
- Please continue to pray for lasting peace in the Middle East, Ukraine, Sudan and everywhere in the world affected by war and conflict.
- Pray for people living in any form of poverty.
Remember the work of REACH and everyone associated in any way.
- Pray for all people and lands devastated by effects of climate change.
Pray that everyone will do what they can to protect & nurture Creation.
- Pray that all producers of food and commodities receive just treatment and fair recompense for their labour and products.
- Pray for migrants and refugees that they will receive just and compassionate help.
- Pray for prisoners, their families and those who work with them.
Remember especially all those associated with HMP Highpoint.
- Pray for Fr. John, Dcn. Huw, the people of our parish, particularly those in care and nursing homes, and the staff and pupils of St Felix School.

Pray for all the people we know and love who have died.

Remember their families and all who grieve.

In our family, when we are not intrusive and ask "may I?"; in our family when we are not selfish and learn to say "thank you"; and when in a family one realises he has done something wrong and knows how to say "sorry" - then in that family there is peace and joy.
