There are two messages that we will hear over the next four weeks of Advent, a time when we look back in order to look forwards.

From the media and the shops comes a loud message and set of values - each one trying to be the loudest in a cacophony. The other message and set of values comes from the gospels a calmer, more measured, message of preparation.

In the first message we are told that we will have to move faster, stay busy, queue longer in the shops, and spend more money on those 'must have' presents so that we will have the 'perfect' Christmas, as if such a thing exists. We are told, and sold, the idea that, unless we buy more and more and surround ourselves with all the trappings of Christmas, we won't be happy. This is most definitely 'fake news.'

The other message and set of values that is offered through the gospels, the prayers and the liturgy of Advent is a very different message. We are being asked to prepare a way for the Lord, to stay awake, to make a straight a path for the Lord and to get ourselves ready to celebrate the birth of Jesus. This is most definitely 'Good News!'

The message of Advent is an invitation and it also a challenge to us. We are called to be looking forward, to be ready, to be prepared and we are asked to wait in joyful hope.
