Dear Friends

Ambition is, in itself, not a bad thing. It is what often accompanies ambition that make it dangerous and destructive.

In the gospel passage this weekend, Jesus teaches us what it means to be truly great. He doesn't say that we shouldn't seek greatness, or try to be the best person we can be, but he turns the common understanding of greatness on its head: 'If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all.'

This teaching doesn't sit easily with us. It's not the way the world thinks or works. People do not get ahead by making sure that they are the last in line. The instruction of Jesus has nothing to do with human wisdom - it doesn't make sense. It makes sense only from the perspective of God's way of judging persons and situations, that is, from the perspective of the Kingdom of God.

Foolish and blind as the disciples were, Jesus was patient with them and took time to instruct them about what greatness means in the context of kingdom he is inaugurating through his suffering, death and resurrection. It means placing ourselves and our talents at the service of others, and of God's reign of justice, peace, and love on earth.

THE KNIFE ANGEL IS IN HAVERHILL DURING SEPTEMBER.



The Knife Angel is the national monument against knife crime and violence amongst young people, a sculpture created by the <u>British Ironworks</u> <u>Centre</u> from 100,000 blades surrendered in amnesty, which has been touring the country for the last two years. This will be its first visit to Suffolk, and an opportunity for the community to come together to reflect on the effects of violence, and to show that together we can help and encourage one another to be better.

Here are some of the ways you can join in over the month:

- See the **art exhibition** at St Mary's from prisoners at HMP Highpoint, including some poignant responses to violent crime from those who have been directly involved or affected.
- Use the prayer station at St Mary's to reflect on your experience of the Knife Angel and to offer to God any particular people or places on your heart.
- Write in the **book of remembrance** at St Mary's if you know someone who has been lost to acts of violence, or in response to events that affect the whole community.
- Speak to one of the many **local community groups** offering advice and support, including Open Mind who are on Market Square every Saturday during September.

- Fill in an **anti-violence pledge** on a wooden heart and leave it at the railings surrounding the Knife Angel.
- Take part in the national **photograph competition** by posting on social media with hashtag #KnifeAngelPhotoCompetition.
- Collect a **colouring sheet** and return your design to Haverhill Arts Centre
