This week marks the end of our celebration of the 2025 Season of Creation, the CAFOD Harvest Fast Day collection, the privilege of having the Jubilee Icon here, the 10th anniversary of Pope Francis' encyclical 'Laudato Si', This year also marks the 800th anniversary of St. Francis' 'The Canticle of Brother Sun'. The following words from Pope Leo could help our reflections on all these events and today's gospel on Faith.

Excerpts from Pope Leo XIV's address at 'The Raising Hope Conference' on Wednesday 1st October 2025.

As with every anniversary of this nature [ie of Laudato Si], we remember the past with gratitude, but we also ask ourselves what remains to be done. Over the years, we have transitioned from understanding and studying the Encyclical to putting it into practice. What must be done now to ensure that caring for our common home and listening to the cry of the earth and the poor do not appear as mere passing trends or, worse still, that they be seen and felt as divisive issues? The Apostolic Exhortation Laudate Deum, published two years ago, noted that "some have chosen to deride" (no. 6) the increasingly evident signs of climate change, and even to blame the poor for the very thing that affects them the most (cf. no. 9).

We must shift from collecting data to caring; and from environmental discourse to an ecological conversion that transforms both personal and communal lifestyles. For believers, this

conversion is in fact no different to the one that orients us towards the living God. We cannot love God, whom we cannot see, while despising his creatures. Nor can we call ourselves disciples of Jesus Christ without participating in his outlook on creation and his care for all that is fragile and wounded.

Dear friends, let your faith inspire you to be bearers of the hope that comes from recognizing the presence of God already at work in history. Let us recall how Pope Francis described Saint Francis of Assisi: He "lived in simplicity and in wonderful harmony with God, with others, with nature and with himself. He shows us just how inseparable the bond is between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society, and interior peace" (Laudato Si', 10). May each of us grow in these four relationships — with God, with others, with nature and with ourselves — through a constant attitude of conversion. We inhabit the same planet, and we must care for it together. I therefore renew my strong appeal for unity around integral ecology and for peace!

It is my hope that the upcoming summits of the United Nations—
the 2025 Climate Change Conference (COP 30), the 53rd Plenary
Session of the Committee on World Food Security, and the 2026
Water Conference—will listen to the cry of the Earth and the cry
of the poor, families, indigenous peoples, involuntary migrants and
believers throughout the world. At the same time, I encourage
everyone, especially young people, parents and those who work in
local and national administrations and institutions, to play their part
in finding solutions for today's "cultural, spiritual and educational
challenges" (Laudato Si', 202), always striving tenaciously for the
common good. There is no room for indifference or resignation.

I would like to conclude with a question that concerns each of us. God will ask us if we have cultivated and cared for the world that he created (cf. Gen 2:15), for the benefit of all and for future generations, and if we have taken care of our brothers and sisters (cf. Gen 4:9; Jn 13:34). What will be our answer?

CAFOD'S HARVEST FAST DAY APPEAL - 2025



This Family Fast Day, your donation means more people like Waré can gain access to safe drinking water without having to walk for miles and hours and carry heavy water containers back home. Waré wanted to build a water supply system in her village so with her neighbours, and supported by CAFOD and local water engineers they built a rain water collection, storage and filtration system so that they (around 300 families) have water for themselves and their livestock in the long months of drought.

There are still women like Waré who daily face a huge challenge to find water for their families, livestock and crops and we can help with our prayers and our Fast Day donations.

During this Jubilee year, we're invited to reflect on the call to renewal, justice and care for our neighbours. This season is a time to give thanks and to share with those overcoming poverty and injustice. By choosing to gift a donation, you can stand alongside farmers like Waré as they build a better future for their children.

THE JUBILEE ICON

To celebrate and commemorate the Pilgrims of Hope Jubilee Year, CAFOD commissioned an icon from Mulugeta Araya, an artist and an engineer who studied at St Mary's College, Wukro, Ethiopia, which is supported by CAFOD.

The Icon was blessed by Cardinal Nichols during the Adoremus congress in September 2024 and is touring the Dioceses of England and Wales during 2025.

It will be at the Diocesan Jubilee of Migrants at St Luke's church in Peterborough at 12 noon on 4 October.

Then the Icon will be here at the 6.30 p.m. Mass at St Felix on 4 October and at the 10 a.m. Mass on 5 October.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PREPARATION PROGRAMME 2026



We run a preparation programme for children in Year 3 or above and their parents each year on Saturday afternoons in term time from **January until June**. We look forward to teaching and supporting the children and parents to develop their understanding of the sacraments of the Eucharist and Reconciliation, and to celebrating with you.

If your child is in Year 3 or above, and you feel they are ready to participate in the programme, you should complete a registration form, which will be available in person from 1st November from Fr John at church. The completed form should be returned to Fr. John by 30th November. Unfortunately, due to limited space and for safety reasons, we have to restrict the number of children we may accept on the programme to twenty. We will only accept official completed forms returned by the deadline, not photocopies.

The St Felix programme is a partnership between the catechists and parents/guardians, and your support at home is vital to your child's learning and engagement.
